PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) POLICY FOR US ECOLOGY DETROIT SOUTH

Minimum PPE required to work onsite at US Ecology Detroit South:

- Respirator with multi-gas & P100 respirator cartridges to enter Chem Fix (Solidification) building
- Safety Glasses
- Long Sleeve Shirt and Pants
- Hard Hat
- Gloves
- High visibility clothing
- Steel Toe Safety Shoes

Non-Certified Washouts/Rinseouts at US Ecology Detroit South:

US Ecology will allow drivers to wash out waste containers (e.g., tanker trucks and vacuum boxes) for a fee that must be approved by the customer. **Drivers are required to supply their own fall protection (harness, lanyard).** It is our company policy that anyone working above 4ft while onsite must use fall protection equipment. If your driver does not have the correct PPE, please have them contact our Scheduling Department at 313-347-1373 to discuss available service options.

Digouts at US Ecology Detroit South:

- Digout services are available for frozen loads or other wastes that become lodged.
- Digouts must be authorized by the customer that will pay the digout fee.
- Digouts require the driver (or transporter management if driver is not authorized) to sign a damage waiver.
- Digouts are an undesirable last resort. Best management practices should be used to prevent frozen or otherwise lodged waste so that digouts are unnecessary. Frozen or otherwise lodged waste is also a safety issue in that it increases the risk of a truck tipping over. Frozen loads may be prevented by keeping moisture from entering the waste (e.g., cover stockpiles, prevent storm water run-on, properly cover waste vehicles, etc.) and by effectively lining trailers/roll-off boxes to promote smooth waste release.

Please note that drivers should remain with their load at all times.

Trailer, boxes or tankers may not be dropped onsite without approval from US Ecology Operations.
