EQ Industrial Services, Inc.'s processing facility permit renewal is approved. You, the permittee, must comply with Indiana's rules for solid waste processing facilities (329 IAC 11) and the terms of this permit.

The facility is a solid waste processing facility that receives non-hazardous waste for consolidation, solidification, and bulking. The solid waste processing facility consists of a one-story building and a depressed dock ramp for storing waste, and a fenced, asphalt paved area for solidifying liquid waste in roll-off containers. The facility has approximately 2.17 acres approved for processing. It is located at 2650 North Shadeland Avenue in Indianapolis, Indiana.

This permit expires on **July 1, 2021**. To operate past this date, you must submit a renewal application on or before **March 3, 2021**.

Public records for your facility are available in IDEM's Virtual File Cabinet at www.in.gov/idem. Documents related to this approval include the application dated July 30, 2015 (VFC #80096925 and #80160542) and supplemental information dated December 18, 2015 (VFC #80187383) and June 17, 2016 (VFC #80318967).

Please note, as the owner or operator of this facility, you are liable for any environmental harm caused by the facility (329 IAC 11-11-4(b)).

If you do not comply with the requirements of this permit, IDEM may modify or revoke this permit (329 IAC 11-11-6) or initiate an enforcement action.

This permit does not: convey property rights of any sort or any exclusive privileges; authorize injury to any person or private property or invasion of other private rights or any infringement of federal, state, or local laws or regulations; or preempt any duty to comply with other state or local requirements (329 IAC 11-11-4(a)).

If you wish to appeal this decision, you must file a request for administrative review with the Office of Environmental Adjudication within 18 days after the postmark of this letter. The enclosed Notice of Decision notifies you of additional important details regarding the appeal process and your rights and responsibilities for filing an adequate and timely appeal.

Your attention to the requirements for managing, containing, and disposing of waste and leachate protects public health and the environment in your community.
